THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

ALL SAINTS DAY. *In much of pre-Christian northern Europe, Nov. 1 was observed as the beginning of the year. On the night before, the dead were believed to rise from their graves and walk the earth. The Church*

“baptized” the day, turning it from a time to fear the dead to a day to honour those who had gone before in the faith. The scripture readings draw our attention to resurrection hope, and life with God.

Wisdom of Solomon 3:1-9. *In earlier Hebrew thinking, life simply ended with death—or, at best, the dead merely existed in an indeterminate state, apart from God. By the 1st century BC, most Jews believed that there is life after death, when the godly will join God and the angels in heaven.*

A reading from Wisdom of Solomon (3:1-9)

But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be a disaster, and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace. For though in the sight of others they were punished, their hope is full of immortality. Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself; like gold in the furnace he tried them, and like a sacrificial burnt-offering he accepted them. In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and will run like sparks through the stubble. They will govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will reign over them for ever. Those who trust in him will understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his holy ones, and he watches over his elect.

Psalm 24. *This psalm was part of an entrance liturgy used when the doors of the temple were opened to admit pilgrims. In the context of All Saints’ Day, it offers assurance that the faithful will ascend Zion and have a place in God’s presence.*

For is it he who founded it upon the seas and made it firm upon the rivers of the deep. “Who can ascend the hill of the Lord? And who can stand in his holy place?” “Those who have clean hands and a pure heart, who have not pledged themselves to falsehood, nor sworn by what is a fraud. They shall receive a blessing from the Lord and a just reward from the God of their salvation.” Such is the generation of those who seek him, of those who seek your face, O God of Jacob. Lift up your heads, O gates; lift them high, O everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in. “Who is this King of glory?” “The Lord, strong and mighty, the Lord, mighty in battle.” Lift up your heads, O gates; lift them high, O everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in. “Who is he, this King of glory?” “The Lord of hosts, he is the King of glory.”

Revelation 21:1-6a. *John has seen the destruction of the old city and of the old heaven and earth. Now he sees the new creation, of divine origin and free of evil forces. God’s love will prevail!*

A reading from Revelation (21:1-6a)

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, ‘See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.’ And the one

who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' Then he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end.'

John 11:32-44. *Lazarus, Mary's brother has died. When Jesus has said to her, "Your brother will rise again", she believed him to be referring to the general resurrection expected at the end of time, but Jesus has said "I am the resurrection and the life".*

When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'



This year marks the 100 anniversary of the end of WWI - Nov. 11, 1918. In Remembrance, taking place the day before Remembrance Day, seeks to recognize and honor this momentous anniversary. The program has been curated by guest conductor Stuart Sladden. Some of the repertoire is related directly to WWI— like In Flanders Fields, Peace (the text was found on a war memorial in London), and Ode to Death (Holst's way to lament the deaths of his friends and the soldiers during WWI). Others, like Ubi Caritas and Prayer of St. Francis, are reminders of the peace. There will come Soft Rains juxtaposes the sadness of war against the hope and resilience of Spring. Finally, our program will conclude with Requiem by Eleanor Daley.
